County Attorney Ben Smith requested that the Board go into closed session to discuss possible litigation.

It was moved by Stock and seconded by Drake at 10:50 am, to go into closed session pursuant to Iowa Code Chapter 21.5(c) to discuss possible litigation. Ayes Hecht, Drake and Stock; nays none, motion carried.

It was moved by Stock and seconded by Drake at 11:30 am, to go out of closed session. Ayes Hecht, Stock and Drake; nays none, motion carried.

The County Engineer updated the Board on activities of the county road crews and the status of current maintenance and construction projects.
