The Sac County Board of Supervisors met in regular session with all members present, Jim Wissler, Chairman, presiding. The minutes of the last meeting were approved as submitted.

It was moved by Wilhelm and seconded by Drake to approve the minutes as submitted. Ayes all, motion carried.

Cole Burdach with ISG presented a preliminary report on some issues in DD 59. There were some areas where the tile line had separated and others where the tile had collapsed. He suggested to the Board the line be televised to identify areas that need repaired or replaced.

It was moved by Wilhelm and seconded by Drake to direct Mr. Burdach to solicit bids to televise the line and make repairs as needed but not to exceed \$24,000 for the total project. Ayes all, motion carried.

The County Engineer updated the Board on activities of the county road crews and the status of current maintenance and construction projects.
