Sac County Launches Next Application Period for Opioid Settlement Funds

Applications Accepted Starting September 14, 2026

Sac City, Iowa — September 8, 2026 — The Sac County Opioid Settlement Fund Committee today announced that applications are now being accepted for opioid settlement funding awards, with the next application window opening September 14, 2026.

Funding Program Overview

The opioid settlement funds are designated for community-based initiatives addressing the opioid crisis. The Sac County Opioid Settlement Funds will be used to better the lives of Sac County residents. The funding is for the prevention, abatement, and treatment of substance misuse. The Sac County Opioid Settlement Committee will make recommendations to the Sac County Board of Supervisors for approval.
